

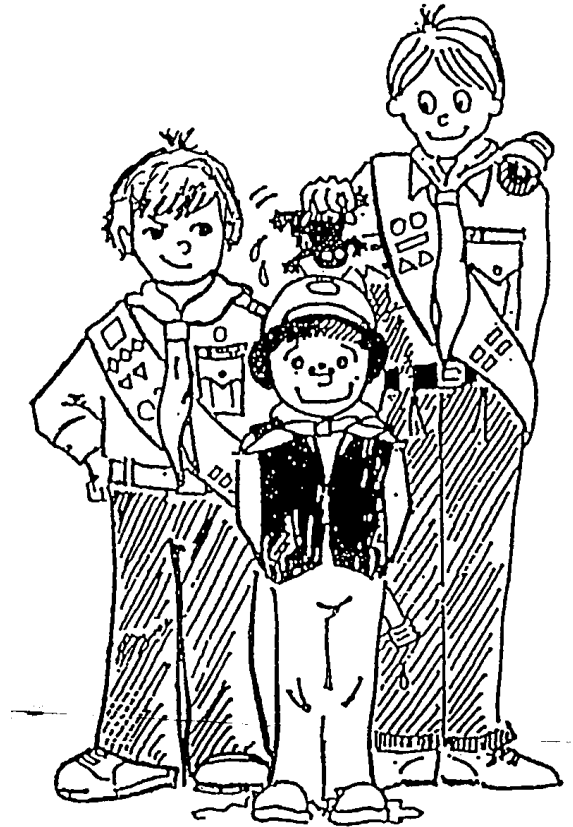


Scouts Canada's Mission:

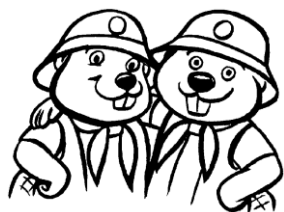

BEAVERS

(5-7 years)

The Beaver program emphasizes having fun while encouraging children to feel good about themselves, their friends and family in a positive group setting. The focus is on sharing, cooperation and teamwork. A Beaver's sense of fun and adventure is built around a lively variety of games, crafts, music, storytelling, playacting, spiritual fellowship and the outdoors. Beavers meet in a group called a Colony, typically once a week, plus outings. The Colony is split into smaller groups called Lodges. There is one leader for every five Beavers. Each Beaver learns a Promise, Law and Motto to help guide their personal development.



WOLF CUBS

(8-10 years)

The major focus for Cubs is on working with others and developing responsibility for individual behavior while learning basic leadership skills and gaining self confidence. Cubbing makes full use of the need for adventure and the vivid imagination of youth of this age. Through a simple award system of Badges and Stars a Cub works to increase their skills and knowledge of the natural world, the outdoors, healthy living, their community, helping others, hobbies and life skills. Cubs meet in a group called a Pack. Pack meetings are usually held once a week with several weekend outings and camps throughout the year. The Pack is divided into smaller groups called Sixes. There is one leader for every six Cubs. The Cubs personal development is guided through a Promise, Law and Motto.



ADULT LEADERSHIP

Scouts Canada relies on the dedication and involvement of thousands of volunteers to provide its programs to young people. There are many different roles available for Scouting volunteers.

Section leaders and their assistants work directly with our youth members to plan and provide fun, exciting, challenging and educational programs. Group Committee and Council volunteers look after the administrative side of Scouting including registration, fundraising, special events and provide support to the section leaders.

Scouts Canada provides volunteers with excellent training opportunities. Introductory training courses, special training sessions and a wealth of resource material provide support and help volunteers acquire the skills they need to be an effective leader.
